Not quite, but since 1942 when a competition was established to cater for US troops who challenged our local nurses. Rebels and Posties were the first local teams and they went on to form, in December 1942, the Victorian Women's Softball Association, later to be known as Victorian Amateur Softball Council of Victoria, then Victorian Softball Association Inc and now Softball Victoria.

Whilst this competition was based at The Domain and/or Fawkner Park the Victorian Women's Softball Association was also responsible for developing softball throughout Victoria. Culminating over time in twenty four affiliated Associations being established around the state, commencing with Ballarat, Geelong, Horsham, Albury and Sunshine, concluding with Keilor Park.

In 1982, 25 years ago, it was agreed that the Melbourne Softball Association should be formed as an affiliated association and the Victorian Softball Association should be representative of all Associations throughout Victoria.

Softball at Fawkner Park has a wealth of history that you, someone you know or someone in the wider community may have been part of.

PRESIDENT AND SECRETARY'S REPORT

MAY, 1983.

It is our privilege and pleasure to present the President and Secretarys Report to the first Annual General Meeting of the Melbourne Softball Association.

I will take this opportunity to give a brief history of Softball in this State and why I believe that by having our own identity at last, is a great achievement.

Up till 16th September, 1982 the Melbourne Softball Association was officially known as the Victorian Softball Association. The Victorian Softball Association was founded in 1942 by members of the now known Melbourne Association namely, Esther Deason, Glory Bain, Bess Dornan and Myrtle Edwards. It is through these members, as well as Marj Dwyer and Merle Short, and others that Softball is still a very popular sport and is due in the main to these people.

Over the past 10 years or so, the number of Affiliated Associations with the Victorian Softball Association, of which we are now one, has grown considerablly and because of these and many other committments to Victoria as well as Melbourne, the competition at Fawkner Park deteriorated.

Over the past 2 - 3 years, you as members of the Victorian Softball Association drew attention to members of the Victorian Softball Association Council the fact that you did not want the competition at Fawkner Park to deteriorate any more.

With this in mind in 1980 a Sub-Committee of the Victorian Softball Association Council was set up to run the competition at Fawkner Park. This worked well for that year, the next year the composition of the Sub-Committee changed it was not as successful as the previous year.

In early 1982, because of the continued pressure from Affiliated Associations, the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation, it was agreed that the Melbourne Softball Association should be formed and the Victorian Softball Association made up of Representatives from all over Victoria. And so on 16th September, 1982 the Melbourne Softball Association was officially formed.

I believe that your Executive, with the assistance of Elaine Duyvestyn have worked extremely hard. Possibly its best achievement has been the Associations Information Booklet currently in the possession of Club Secretaries. This Booklet contains all the Associations information such as Constitution, Playing By-Laws, Policies on Clearances/Permits, Hire of Clubrooms, Hire of Pitching Machine and Guildelines for Official positions of Melbourne teams, and players. To my knowledge we are the only Association to have compiled such a Booklet.

Setting up a new Association is extremelly difficult and costly. We had to design and print letterheads, badges, and Melbourne Uniforms almost overnight, and meet our financial commitment to the Victorian Softball Association. We also decided to subsidize all Representatives of Melbourne teams competing at Victorian Championships, accommodation expenses, as well as continuing the past practice of subsidizing air fares to Melbourne members selected in Victorian teams. These expenses along with the increase in ground fees to the Melbourne City Council, last year \$2,000 and this year \$3,210, for Senior teams only pressitated increases in team entry fees teams only, necessitated increases in team entry fees.

Interstate Championships.

An Australian Team was selected to go to Hong Kong in June - July this year, and Midge Nelson was selected as Assistant Coach, and Glory Bain as

co-operation.

This team competed at Waverely and were runners-up to Wavereley Open Team: in the Grand Final. What an excellent effort, considering they

had no Coach for training for some time. We were the underdogs in the Final and at one stage we led. This was a truly great performance as Wavereley had 6 past Victorian or Australian representatives and we had 5 under 17 players. Our sincere thanks to the officials Mary Frost, Pat Viktorin, Wilma Murdoch

and Kaye Hewitt for their co-operation and efforts.

Our Under 17 team ventured to Knox and whilst they did not make Under 17: the final performed on the diamond quite satisfactory.
Unfortunately the teams attitude prior to the Tournament left a lot to be desired. It was hoped that a big leason has been learnt not only by the players in the team but also the Our sincere thanks to the Officials, Ron Morrish, Maree Williams, Barbara Breen and Judy Wilson for their co-operation Executive. and efforts. Our congratulations are extended to Midge Nelson, for being selected unanimously by 52 countries, to appear in the "Hall of Fame" in America. Midge is the first player to achieve this, as she will be appearing with other sports people who are all administrators. In closing we would like to express our sincere thanks to our fellow Executive members, for their help and assistance. To Mr & Mrs. Howson and Mrs. Collins for their efforts in the Canteen, to Jill Lindsay, Ground Staff, Midge Nelson and members of the Coaching committe and all members of the Association who contributed in many ways, especially with the Roster duty contributed in many ways, especially with the Roster duty. Special thanks to the members of the Umpires Association who give their time so freely for ensuring that our games are played each Sunday. We thank you all for your efforts this year and hope that with your continuing support and help we can all make this a great association once again.
